Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

FAFSA 101

The 2010-2011 FAFSA will be available beginning January 1, 2010 for financial aid processing.

FAFSA on the Web Worksheet

The FAFSA on the Web Worksheet is a tool that allows students and parents to read and complete the questions before entering the required information online. The questions are listed in the same order that they appear on the Web site.

Requesting your PIN

The applicant's PIN can be used each year to electronically apply for federal student aid and to access individual Federal Student Aid records online. The applicant has the option to create and sign the FAFSA with a PIN during the actual application process, as well.

Dependency Status Worksheet

The **Dependency Status Worksheet** helps students determine if they need to provide parental information on the FAFSA.

FAFSA4caster

The FAFSA4caster, at <u>www.fafsa4caster.ed.gov</u>, is an online tool that helps students and parents determine eligibility for federal student aid. Counselors should encourage students to use the FAFSA4caster and learn how much aid they would receive if they applied today.

Apply for State Grants & Scholarships

The *Florida Financial Aid Application* opened December 1st and is now available for seniors to complete <u>online</u>.

One application determines eligibility for the following state grants and scholarships:

- Florida Bright Futures Scholarship
- José Martí Scholarship Challenge Grant Fund
- Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship Program
- Rosewood Family Scholarship Program
- Scholarships for Children and Spouses of Deceased or Disabled Veterans and Servicemembers

Other state scholarship and grant programs require application through the students' postsecondary institutions and may also require submission of the FAFSA.

College Goal Sunday is January 31, 2010. From 2 p.m. - 5 p.m., high school seniors and families in your area will be able to receive FREE expert assistance completing the FAFSA.
