FASTER submission for Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program / Florida Private Schools

The Florida Department of Education announced that Florida private schools submitting student transcript information via the Florida Automated System for Transferring Educational Records (FASTER) must submit a minimum of 200 transcripts per grade level.

Remember to Update the FAFSA!

During the application process, all 2013-2014 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) applicants, who indicate that they have already filed a federal tax return, will be expected to use the <u>IRS Data Retrieval Tool</u>. Anyone indicating that they "will file" a tax return, will be advised to use the IRS Data Retrieval to update their information after their 2012 federal income tax return has been filed. Applicants who are selected for verification will be required to either use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool or obtain a tax transcript from the IRS and submit it to their financial aid administrator.
