# Florida Legislative Session 2013

The 2013 Florida Legislative Session ended May 3, 2013, and passed bills that affect state-funded financial aid programs administered by the Office of Student Financial Assistance. Some of the changes are as follows:

- **SB 1076** Effective July 1, 2013. Signed by the Governor on April 22, 2013.
  - Repeals FAFSA requirement for Bright Futures funding.
  - Amends high school diploma designations.
- **SB 1720** Effective July 1, 2013. Signed by the Governor on May 20, 2013.
  - Repeals FAFSA requirement for Bright Futures, Florida Resident Access Grant, and Access to Better Learning and Education Grant.

**SB 1500 (General Appropriations Act)** — Effective July 1, 2013. Signed by the Governor on May 20, 2013. State scholarship and grant programs saw a one percent decrease overall. However, Florida saw an increase in award amounts for Bright Futures, Florida Student Assistance Grant, Flori-



da Resident Access Grant, and Access to Better Learning and Education Grant for the 2013-14 academic year.

• Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program (BF) – \$309,413,826 Specifies BF award amounts per credit hour for the 2013-14 academic year. See the award amounts on page 2 of this newsletter.

## **Tips for Planning Financial Aid Nights!**



**Start Planning Early** – OSFA Outreach Representatives schedule events on a first-come, first-served basis.

**Avoid Conflicts** – Please verify that your school will not have an event that would impede participation, e.g., sports events, holidays, or testing.

**Technology** – Make sure that all needed equipment is in working order. Remember to verify with your IT administrator that there are no potential firewalls that may block needed websites.

Advertise – Many students indicate they did not know about the event until the last minute. Use various mediums to get the word out. (Facebook, radio, Twitter, E-mail)

**Transportation** – If transportation is a barrier for some of your students, consider holding the event during school hours so that students are able to use school or city transportation to go home.

**Refreshments** – Let's face it, food is an excellent incentive for participation.
