
# IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENTS

# **FAFSA Completion Tool**

Did you know there are tools that will help you determine how many of your high school seniors have completed the FAFSA?

- Visit <u>www.StudentAid.ed.gov</u> and use the search box to enter FAFSA Completion by High School.
- The Florida College Access Network (FCAN) also has a tool, "The Florida FAFSA Finish Line", that features the FAFSA completion rates for 12th graders at over 500 public schools in Florida, including district- and statelevel figures. Included in the dashboard are 11 different filters that can help counselors and administrators chart the progress of their schools and track progress statewide.
- Your district liaison can contact the Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) to discuss participating in the 2016-17 FAFSA Completion Project. Through this effort, districts can enter into a formal agreement with OSFA to access student-level FAFSA completion data. The student-level FAFSA completion indicator will only populate (as outlined below) for students whose transcripts have been provided to OSFA.

Y = has completed N = not completed I = incomplete
