

NyFF Online Training



April: Financial Literacy Month

It may seem far away, but April will be here before you know it. Think about ways that your school can participate in this national initiative. Ideas include:

- Hosting a financial education day on campus have all lessons for one day pertain to money.
 - English write an essay on a money topic.
 - History explore the history of money.
 - Science discuss how money is made and how science factors into the security features that prevent counterfeiting.
 - Math problem-solve compound interest as it pertains to student loans; discuss how to create a budget.

FASTWEB Update

A parent asked how to answer two questions on the website www.Fastweb.com. The questions pertained to school name and LOAN AMOUNT.

As it turned out, the questions were an advertisement for a private student loan, in the middle of the web page! The parent was advised to have his daughter seek scholarships by setting up a profile and going through the official matching process.

Please be sure to inform parents and students that there are advertisements on this website. This is a national scholarship database. Scholarship applications do NOT request a loan amount.

Sometimes we take it for granted that families know these things when actually they do not. Let's err on the side of "too much information" just to make sure everyone is on the same page.
