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IRS Data Retrieval Tool NOTICE

Many students applying for federal financial aid to attend college are experiencing an unwelcome surprise during the application process. The IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT) is currently unavailable to import tax information on <u>www.FAFSA.gov</u>. Without this important option, families are in panic mode about how to get their tax information reported on the application.

Good news! Families can still enter the information <u>manually</u> and submit the application. The IRS has more guidance for obtaining tax information <u>HERE</u>.

Free Tax Assistance

Families in your community need assistance filing taxes? We wanted to let you know about a great program that a statewide nonprofit collaboration, Florida Prosperity Partnership (FPP), and its partners have made available to Floridians called <u>www.FreeFLTaxSites.org</u>.

With this website, anyone in the state can find a convenient location with Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) or a Facilitated Self Assistance website link to do their tax return from the comfort of their own home <u>with</u> IRS certified volunteers standing by to answer their questions. Most free services are available to people who make \$64,000 or less per year, although, some do not have income restrictions.
