# **Important Announcements**



Alert your mid-year (December) graduates that they must complete the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) by <u>August 31, 2017</u>, if they wish to receive funding for spring term 2018. There are NO EXCEP-TIONS to this application deadline. If a student does not graduate mid-year as planned and wishes to apply as an end-of-year graduate, the student must submit the 2018-19 FFAA (which opens October 1).

## **Legislative Update:**

**Florida Academic Scholars (FAS)** will receive an award to cover 100% of tuition and applicable fees plus \$300 for both fall and spring semesters for additional college-related expenses. The Bright Futures Student Handbook, Chapter 2, provides more details including which fees are covered.
