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Financial Literacy Month

April is designated by the U.S. Government as **Financial Literacy Month**. This is a great opportunity to promote financial wellness for students.

Economic lessons can sometimes seem too abstract for students. "Teaching the News" not only puts these lessons into real life perspective but it also helps educate your students on how to critically engage with current events. Use these current events to teach the news in your classroom. Following each article, you will find several related resources from EconEdLink.org for teaching the underlying economics and personal finance concepts.

Consider hosting a "Lunch and Learn" where students can use their lunch period to ask questions about financial topics of interest. This may prompt future meetings once you see what students are truly concerned about when it comes to managing finances.

Plan a day of financial awareness with trivia questions/prizes, guests from local banking institutions and credit unions offering free student checking accounts. Emphasize the importance of saving for college.
