Rise in Industry Certifications

The Commissioner of Education, Pam Stewart, announced that industry certification completions are on the rise. In 2015 -16, high school students earned a total of 81,970 industry certifications, and in 2016-17, that number jumped to 102,044 industry certifications.

Career and Technical Education opportunities provide students with a school-to-career connection. More than 400,000 Florida students are enrolled in secondary technical education programs.

Featured Financial Assistance Program

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA), administers a variety of state-funded grants and scholarships to assist Florida residents with the cost of their postsecondary education.

William L. Boyd, IV, Florida Resident Access Grant (FRAG) Program

Program Description

The William L. Boyd, IV, Florida Resident Access Grant Program provides tuition assistance to Florida undergraduate students attending an eligible private, non-profit Florida college or university. Each participating institution determines application procedures, deadlines and student eligibility.

Applying for an Award

The student will meet the application procedures established by the participating institution. Applications may be obtained at the financial aid offices of eligible Florida postsecondary institutions.

Student Requirements

- Be a Florida resident and a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen. A student's residency and citizenship status are determined by the postsecondary institution. Questions regarding such status should be directed to the financial aid office or admissions office of the institution the student plans to attend.
- Not owe a repayment or be in default under any state or federal grant, loan or scholarship program unless satisfactory arrangements to repay have been made.
- Not have previously received a baccalaureate degree.
- Enroll for a minimum of 12 credit hours per term, or the equivalent, at an eligible Florida college or university in a baccalaureate degree program.
- Meet Florida's general eligibility requirements for receipt of state aid.
- Not be enrolled in a program of study leading to a degree in theology or divinity.



Outreach Services Update

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) Outreach Services will continue to offer high schools the following free resources to assist in planning financial aid nights and Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) labs.

Speakers' Bureau

OSFA has partnered with local state colleges and universities to provide "in-person" financial aid presentations and FAFSA lab assistance. If you have already submitted an event request, we have placed you on our master event list and started the matching process. You will be provided the speaker's contact information after confirmation of event details.
