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REMINDERS for Senior Students

Time is running out to complete the **Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA)**. Please encourage all seniors to apply PRIOR to graduation, August 31st at the latest.

The ACT/SAT exams may be taken through June 30, 2018.

REMINDERS for Junior Students

Now is the time to help junior year students complete their FSA ID in preparation for the early FAFSA season which begins October 1, 2018. OSFA-STATE HS: #17-1:07 Bright Futures 8th Final Evaluation for 2017-18 High School Seniors

Final (8th semester) transcripts for seniors may be sent electronically or online to OSFA. Final transcripts should include all coursework, final grades, total service hours, industry certifications, and graduation dates for your seniors. Please note, for 2018 seniors, the FASTER address value is 1881. After May 18, 2018, transcripts sent to the FASTER address for Early evaluation (7th semester) will be rejected and the submission will receive an error message. After May 18, 2018, private high school counselors may begin copying transcripts from Early to Final evaluation.

Seniors may continue testing through June 30, 2018. Official test scores for college entrance exams are verified by the Florida Department of Education (FDOE) repository.

We encourage counselors to submit Final transcripts, including the high school graduation date, as soon after graduation as possible. A student will be evaluated as 'Ineligible' if no high school graduation date is on the student's Final transcript. Districts and counselors will be able to see students' evaluations in the Online Transcript Entry and Evaluation System (OTEES). OSFA will begin posting notices for eligible students in July. International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) Diploma students will receive notices after OSFA receives official files from these two organizations in late summer and early fall.

NOTE: Please resend any final transcripts if you see the transcripts remaining in Early evaluation.

Encourage eligible students who have not completed the 2018-19 FFAA to do so by August 31, 2018. Students who do not have an FFAA on file will not be eligible to receive an award. Students choosing to go out of state for postsecondary study should still fill out an application in case the student decides to attend a Florida postsecondary institution within two years of graduating.

Reports

We encourage counselors to use the *Students Summary Statistics Report* to assist with Final evaluations of 2018 high school graduates. This report provides comprehensive information of students' potential award and application statuses. (Available on the OTEES website.)



Statutory Responsibilities for Public Districts/Schools

School district's responsibilities for Bright Futures are outlined in Florida Statute (F.S.). Please review again these responsibilities.

Section (s.) 1009.531(4), F.S.

- Annually provide <u>each</u> high school student a complete, accurate Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Evaluation Report and Key.
- Disclose (on Student Report Card) that Bright Futures grade point average (GPA) may differ from the GPA on the report card.

<u>Section (s.) 1009.534(1)(e), F.S.; s. 1009.535(1)(e), F.S.; s. 1009.536(1)(e), F.S.;</u> Develop processes, approved by the district, so that students may document service hours earned.

OSFA assists districts and private schools in providing the required Evaluation Report and Key, which can be found on OTEES. To facilitate OSFA in providing the reports for public high school students, districts are requested to send their student transcripts via FASTER three times per year to the Florida Department of Education.

Role of the School Counselor

Parents, the press, administrators and the general public often wonder just what it is that school counselors do on a daily basis.
