Special Direct Consolidation Loan Information - High-Level Overview for FFEL Lenders and Lender Servicers

The Information for Financial Aid Professionals (IFAP) website posted an October 26, 2011, Electronic Announcement, first of a series of communications to inform the financial aid community about the availability of a short-term Special Direct Consolidation Loan opportunity through the William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) Program. This special consolidation opportunity will be offered to eligible borrowers by the U.S. Department of Education (the Department) from January - June 30, 2012.

In "Getting Started — High-Level Overview," the Department addresses:

- What is the Special Direct Consolidation Loan process, and how will FFELP lenders and lender-servicers fit into that process?
- What form will FFELP lenders and lender-servicers use to verify loans for the Special Direct Consolidation Loan process?
- What will be different about the special Loan Verification Certificate FFELP lenders and lender-servicers will use?

You will be kept informed through subsequent communications on the <u>IFAP</u> and <u>Financial Partners Portal</u> websites. Generally, these communications will be Electronic Announcements that include the words "Special Direct Consolidation Loan Information" in the subject line.
