The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) is pleased to offer you an Internet-based option to fulfill the loan counseling requirements. To complete the Initial Loan Counseling requirement, click on the "Entrance" button. To complete the Exit Loan Counseling requirement, click on the "Exit" button. Once you have started a session, you must complete it. If you exit the session prior to completion, you will be required to begin again. Each session should take approximately 20 minutes to complete.

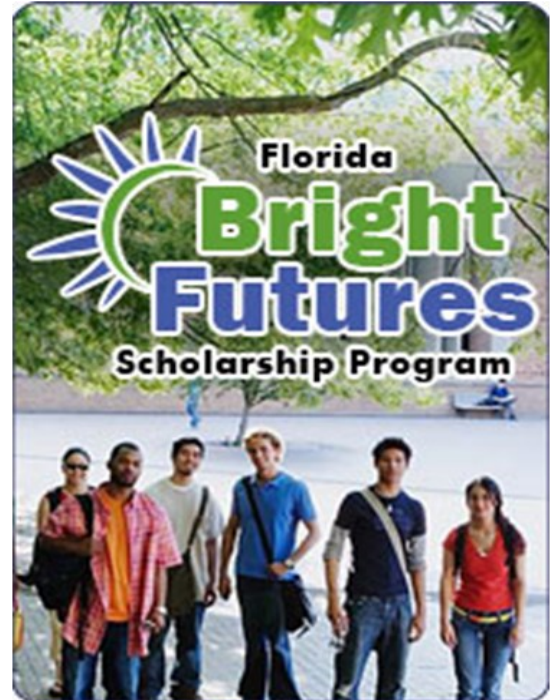

2012-2013 ISIR Guide

The Federal Student Aid has announced the posting of the [2012-2013 ISIR Guide](#). The ISIR Guide assists financial aid administrators (FAAs) in interpreting student information on the Institutional Student Information Record (ISIR). ISIRs contain processed student information reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), as well as key processing results and National Student Loan Data System (NSLDS) financial aid history information. ISIRs are sent electronically to institutions by the Central Processing System (CPS).

Fraud in Postsecondary Distance Education Programs

The Department of Education is providing guidance to colleges to address potential fraud in the Federal student aid programs at institutions of higher education that offer distance education programs. This [letter](#) provides an overview of the fraud schemes that the Department's Inspector General (IG) detected, and recommends immediate steps that institutions can take to detect and prevent fraud. In this letter is also described further actions that institutions can take and that the Federal government is committed to taking, including increasing technical assistance to institutions of higher education, the convening of a Department-wide task force on distance education fraud, and plans for recommending legislative and regulatory changes to address the relevant issues.
