Shopping Sheet

As part of an ongoing effort to help students understand the costs of a postsecondary education each academic year, the U.S. Department of Education (ED) has prepared a "<u>Shopping Sheet</u>." This individualized standard financial aid form assists students with understanding their costs before making the final decision on which postsecondary institution to enroll. The Shopping Sheet, developed by ED partnered with the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, will allow students to easily compare financial aid packages offered by different postsecondary institutions.

In addition, the Shopping Sheet clarifies the costs and responsibilities of student loans before students have enrolled. It outlines their total estimated annual costs, institutional rates of completion and default, and provides information about students' potential monthly loan payments after graduation. Ultimately, this tool provides students and their families with useful information that can assist students in making a logical decision about where to attend college as well as help them better understand the debt burdens they may face after graduation.
