FSA ID/PIN Replacement Successfully Implemented

On May 10, 2015, Federal Student Aid (FSA) implemented the FSA ID. This modernized log-in process improves the security and customer experience for our student and borrower websites, which include *FAFSA on the Web*, NSLDS Student Access, Student-Loans.gov, StudentAid.gov, and TEACH Grant. The new FSA ID, which is comprised of a user-selected username and password, replaces the Federal Student Aid PIN as the process by which students, parents, and borrowers authenticate their identity to access their federal student aid information.

As part of FSA's commitment to ensure a seamless transition for our customers, users at the impacted websites are directed to a link to register for their new FSA ID. Registration should take less than 7 minutes and only the owner of the FSA ID should create his or her account.

- Term 3 quarter refunds of Bright Futures dropped/withdrawn course funds are due within 30 days of the institution's last day of each term.
- All institutional applications for 2015-16 participation will be evaluated. Notifications are posted online July 1.
- Grade & Hours Reports are due within 30 days after the last day of classes or June 30, whichever comes first.
- June is the deadline for updating student program disbursement records; thereafter, an e-mailed request must be sent to the Office of Student Financial Assistance for late changes.
- Fiscal year ends June 30 for state of Florida scholarship and grant programs.

Federal Student Aid (FSA) announces the availability of FSA's <u>Financial Literacy Guidance</u>. Counselors and mentors now have access to the latest resources to help improve postsecondary students' financial management skills. Financial literacy is a critical part of every student's education, whether the student is about to enter the workforce or make a decision about where to go to college and how to pay for it. The *Financial Literacy Guidance* provides a framework that institutional professionals can use to inform financial aid recipients and students about key financial concepts to help them make informed budgeting, borrowing, and loan repayment decisions.
