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Summer Funding

The 2018 Florida Legislature passed and Governor Rick Scott signed Senate Bill 4, which permanently expands the Bright Futures program to provide for Bright Futures Florida Academic Scholars (FAS) to receive 100% of the cost of tuition and fees, including summer 2018.

This includes not only any FAS eligible for funding for the 2017-18 academic year, but also any 2018 high school graduate who has been officially evaluated as a Florida Academic Scholar.

The Office of Student Financial Assistance is notifying all 2018 high school graduates eligible for FAS about the availability of funding for the 2018 summer term. Students will be informed that funding is only available if their postsecondary institution allows them to enroll as a degree-seeking student during the summer.

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

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) is pleased to provide the online 2018-19 Renewal Eligibility Application for Institutional Participation in State Scholarship and Grant Programs, available **May 1** - **June 8, 2018**. Rule 6A-20.002(1)(j), Florida Administrative Code, requires postsecondary institutions to annually complete this application for evaluation to receive state financial aid funds.

- ⇒ Online 2018-19 Renewal Eligibility
 Application for Institutional Participation
 in State Scholarship and Grant Programs
 is available from May 1 through June 8.
- ⇒ June 6, 2018: Deadline for Bright Futures PSI Certifications. Certify institutional cumulative GPA/hours.
- Submit Grade and Hours report, due 30 days of the institution's last day of the term or by June 30th.
- ⇒ July 1, 2018, is the beginning of the new fiscal year for state scholarship and grant programs.
