# State Scholarship & Grant Programs

## August

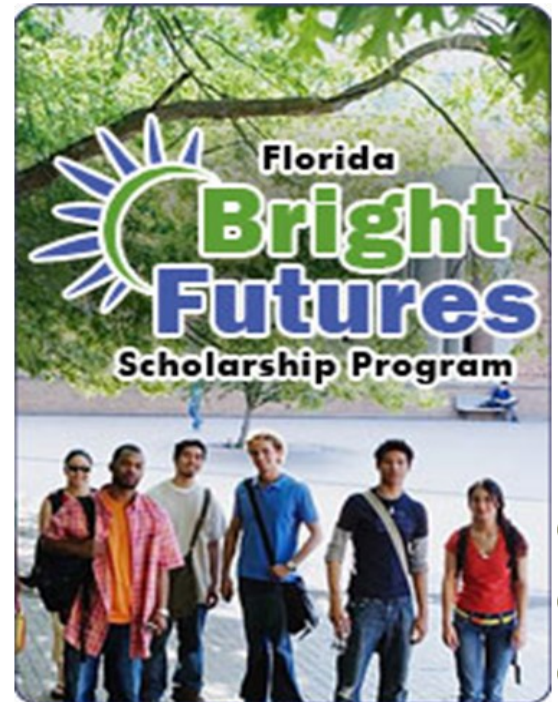
- State scholarship and grant financial aid programs begin funding in the fall and end in the spring.
- Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program initial 8th semester evaluations and award notifications sent.
- August 31 – The *Initial Student Florida Financial Aid Application* closes. By this date, all school districts have completed graduation (including summer session) for the prior academic year.

## September

- Grade and Hours Report deadline is September 30 for current summer term Bright Futures re-evaluation of renewal eligibility.

## September/October

- Term 1 Disbursement Eligibility Report (DER) is due to OSFA 30 days after the last day of drop/add.

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA), is proud to offer the National Training for Counselors and Mentors (NT4CM): Funding Education Beyond High School workshops throughout the state of Florida.

NT4CM workshops are designed for guidance counselors and mentors who assist students and their families in preparing financially for college. Participants learn how to access free resources such as fact sheets, brochures, and PowerPoint presentations.

All workshop sessions are free and include up-to-date information regarding federal and state student financial aid programs, college early awareness/planning, the FAFSA4caster, financial literacy resources, and financial aid nights for students and their families.

## Remaining 2010-11 Interest Rates

The U.S. Department of Education (ED) announced two categories of interest rates on Federal Stafford, Federal PLUS, Federal Supplemental Loan for Students (SLS) loans, and Federal Consolidation Interest Rate Calculations for the period July 1, 2010 – June 30, 2011. Interest rates for older PLUS and SLS loans are based on the weekly average of the one-year constant-maturity Treasury yield for the last calendar week ending on or before June 26. Interest rates for the Healthy Eating Active Living portion of Federal Consolidation loans are based on the 91-day Treasury bill auctioned for the quarter ending June 30. These rates do not affect Federal Stafford or Federal PLUS loans made on or after July 1, 2006 that are subject to fixed-rates. The entire announcement is available [online](#).

## 2011 Florida Department of Education/Macy's Teacher of the Year

Cheryl Conley, a fourth grade teacher at Osceola Magnet Elementary School in Indian River County, was named the 2011 Florida Department of Education/Macy's Teacher of the Year. Conley was chosen from among five state finalists for recognition of her tremendous dedication to her students, her goal-oriented teaching style, and her proven ability to inspire students beyond their own expectations. She will serve for one year as the Christa McAuliffe Ambassador for Education and visit schools throughout the state to share information about educational opportunities and challenges in Florida.

Conley received a cash prize of \$10,000 from Macy's, a customized trophy, and an all-expenses paid trip to New York City for the Macy's Thanksgiving Day parade. Macy's awarded each of the other four finalists — Kelly Burnette, Yulee High School, Nassau County; Zachary Champagne, Mandarin Oaks Elementary School, Duval County; Cristine O'Hara, Palmetto Middle School, Miami-Dade County; and Allan Phipps, South Plantation High School, Broward County — a \$5,000 check, a \$500 Macy's gift card, and \$1,000 cash to their respective schools for educational programs.
