OSFA Offers NATIONAL TRAINING FOR COUNSELORS AND MENTORS (NT4CM)

The Florida Department of Education, Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) is proud to offer National Training for Counselors and Mentors (NT4CM), Funding Education Beyond High School, workshops throughout the state of Florida.

NT4CM workshops are designed for guidance counselors and mentors who assist students and their families in preparing financially for college. Participants learn how to access free workshop resources, such as fact sheets, brochures, and PowerPoint presentations.

All workshop sessions are free and include up-to-date information for students and their families regarding federal and state student financial aid programs, college early awareness/planning, the FAFSA4caster, financial literacy resources, and conducting financial aid nights.

NT4CM workshops will be offered November through February at strategic locations throughout Florida.

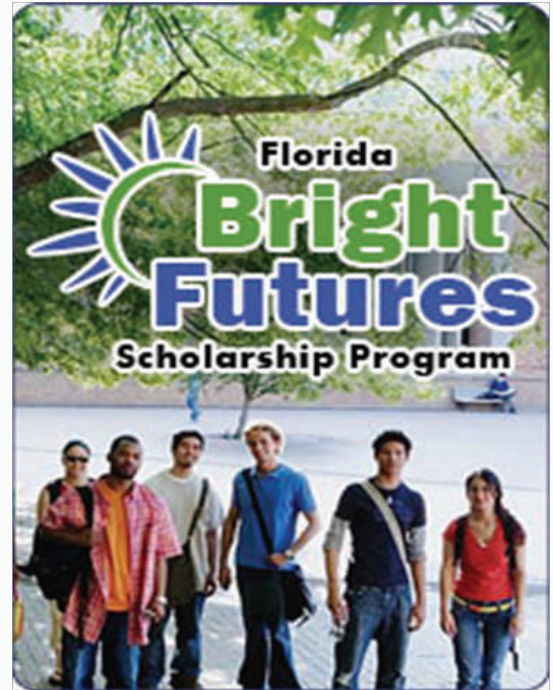

NCHELP Issues Survey on FFELP Services

The National Council of Higher Education Loan Program (NCHELP) conducted a recent survey, from its voting members, seeking information on their involvement in college access, financial literacy, and default prevention programs. The data yielded some impressive results. In the last year, NCHELP's voting members (90 percent reporting) provided:

- Hands-on financial literacy, college awareness, and financial aid training to more than 1.4 million students and parents.
- More than 14 million brochures and other publications on diverse early outreach and financial aid topics. Many publications were in multiple languages.
- Training for more than 26,000 school guidance counselors who then assisted thousands of students in pursuing their postsecondary goals.
- Assistance for more than 6 million students, parents, school, and lender representatives via telephone and e-mail.
- Training for 62,000 financial aid administrators (and made over 5,400 campus visits) to assist with the processing of loan funds.

In addition to strong outreach and training efforts, Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) Program organizations have developed customized default prevention programs to help borrowers who are having trouble repaying their student loans. Thanks to these efforts, in fiscal year 2008 more than \$60 billion in delinquent FFEL Program loans were successfully returned to repayment status.

Note: NCHELP's voting members consist of state guaranty agencies and non-profit organizations that employ nearly 600 professionals who are devoted to increasing college enrollment and graduation numbers and improving financial literacy in their states.

Florida Colleges Benefit From Nursing Scholarships

The Foundation for Florida's Community Colleges distributed \$273,882 in September for nursing and allied health scholarships. More than one million dollars have been awarded since 2006. The Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Florida Endowed Scholarship for Nursing and Allied Health works to increase the number and diversity of individuals entering the nursing and health fields. The scholarships were awarded to Florida's 28 state colleges and matched with support from local communities. Scholarship recipients were selected by the community colleges where they were enrolled.
